Human factors constitute the success story of any nation or a social institute. Enormous human resources can be a liability when the total manpower, available and latent, is not utilized, and can be considered as an asset when every head and hand is put to productive work. It is, therefore not the size of the human population of a nation, but it is the quality of human beings upon whom the nation's greatest achievements and credibility depend. Transformation of human liabilities into human assets of the country, thus, constitutes the single vital task force that needs immediate attention of this "developing democratic welfare state." The future of any country depends upon the quality of its young people, their motivation, their aspiration, and their ambitions and in the final analysis, their character.
